

Accessibility statement for alwingtonparish.org

This website is run by Alwington Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts,
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen,
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard,
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software,
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver),
- We've also made the website text as simple as possible to understand.

AbilityNet (<https://mcmw.abilitynet.org.uk/>) has advice on making your device easier to use if you have a disability.

How accessible this website is

We know some parts of this website are not fully accessible:

- Some images do not have accompanying text.
- Users need to tab through individual items rather than being able to skip straight to the content.
- The main headings overlap when using screen magnification tools to zoom into the page content.
- There is currently no site map to assist users navigate through the website.

We are working to resolve these issues and aim to be compliant with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines Version 2.1 (AA standard) by November 2024.
